



SEATTLE SQUEEZE ALERT

Beginning Monday, February 4, on-street parking restrictions and uniformed police officers at key intersections will remain for up to two weeks

Overview

The Seattle Squeeze, Seattle's new era of tough traffic, will create more congestion and additional street closures and delays in and around downtown over the next five years. All this will be worth it, but everyone needs to stay informed have a plan for how they are getting around. People, businesses, schools, manufacturers, and others rely on the timely delivery of products and goods, and we want to ensure they move as predictably and efficiently as possible.

When the new SR 99 tunnel opens in early February, traffic patterns downtown will change again as travelers adjust to their new routes. In anticipation of these changes, we are maintaining parking restrictions on key streets downtown and placing uniformed police officers at key intersections to ensure transit and emergency responders can reach their destinations quickly and safely. On 1st Ave, temporary parking restrictions are in place from 6 AM - 7 PM on February 4 until February 15, at which point permanent parking restrictions will be installed during the peak hours of 6-9 AM and 3-7 PM Monday-Friday. These parking restrictions are in place to keep bus service reliable.
