Transit Service Change: September 21, 2019

Enjoy more trips on bus routes in Seattle.



Tolling the SR 99 Tunnel: November 9, 2019

Expect more traffic on downtown streets. Toll rates will be \$1 to \$2.25 with a Good To Go! pass.



Connect 2020: January 2020

Prepare for 10 weeks of reduced light rail service while crews connect the 12 new stations of Sound Transit's East Link (opening 2023). There will also be three weekend closures in October and November 2019.
